THE 2023 <u>CHRISTOPHER N.H. JENKINS AWARD</u> <u>Recipient</u>: DR. Scarlett Lin Gomez



ARCH is pleased to announce that Scarlett Lin Gomez, MPH, PhD is the 2023 Christopher N.H. Jenkins Award recipient! This reward recognizes Dr.

Gomez's significant achievements in communityoriented cancer prevention and control efforts for Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders. Dr. Gomez is a Professor in UCSF Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics and a key member of the Helen Diller Family Comprehensive Cancer Center, where she is part of the Population Sciences Program and a part of the Leadership Committee of the Prostate Cancer Program. Dr. Gomez's many accomplishments include the development of the California Neighborhoods Data System, a compilation of small-area level data on social and built environmental characteristics and has used these data in more than a dozen funded studies to evaluate the impact of social and built neighborhood environment factors on disease outcomes. Furthermore, she has significantly contributed surveillance data on cancer incidence, outcomes, and trends among distinctive Asian American, Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, and Hispanic ethnic groups, as well as cancer patterns based on nativity status and neighborhood characteristics.

Dr. Gomez's impactful work and contributions to cancer data collection, research on multilevel drivers of cancer health disparities, and mentorship continues to aid Asian American and Pacific Islander communities, providing strategies for understanding and addressing their cancer burdens.

Dr. Gomez will be honored and speak at a virtual Jenkins Award Reception on Thursday, October 26, 2023 from 12:00-1:30 PM PST. **Please register** here to join us!

DR. VAN TA PARK WITH TWO NEW GRANTS AWARDED FROM NATIONAL INSTITUTE ON AGING

The Collaborative Approach for Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander Research and Education (CARE 2.0) project has secured a \$16.1 million 5-year grant from the NIH/NIA with ARCH member Dr. Van Ta Park as the lead Multiple Principal Investigator, alongside ARCH Co-Director Dr. Janice Tsoh as Multiple Principal Investigator and other ARCH members, Drs. Arnab Mukherjea and Oanh Meyer, as co-Is.

The Asian Cohort for Alzheimer's Disease (ACAD) project has received a \$40 million 5-year grant from the NIH/NIA with ARCH member Dr. Van Ta Park as Multiple Principal Investigator.

Dr. Adrian M. Bacong has recently become a T32 Postdoctoral Fellow in the Division of Endocrinology in the Department of Medicine at Stanford University. Dr. Bacong has also been awarded an American Heart Association "Assessing Race in Clinical Research Models" Data Science Grant. His project, "Evaluating Cardiovascular Risk Algorithms Among Single and Multiracial/Multiethnic Asian People" will use electronic health record data to assess the use of "race correction" factors in risk prediction and explore other social indicators as alternatives to race.
