# ANNOUNCING ASPIRE: THE FIRST ASIAN AMERICAN COHORT STUDY FOR CANCER RESEARCH

Led by principal investigators Drs. Scarlett Gomez, Iona Cheng and Salma Shariff-Marco, ASPIRE is the first Asian American cohort study for cancer research funded by the National Cancer Institute. Several ARCH members are co-investigators or advisors on this cohort study. Please stay tuned as ASPIRE will engage with the ARCH community for input as the project advances.



## The first Asian American cohort study for cancer research

#### WHY DO WE NEED AN ASIAN AMERICAN COHORT STUDY?

1. Asian Americans are the fastest growing and most diverse racial group in the U.S.

- Asian Americans have doubled in population since 2000
- They represent over 30 countries and speak over 100 languages and dialects

## 2. Asian American populations have unique cancer disparities.

- Cancer is the leading cause of death in most Asian American ethnic groups
- Asian American women who have never smoked have the highest rates of lung cancer compared to all other racial and ethnic groups
- Breast cancer rates are rapidly increasing among Asian American women, especially among recent immigrants and those under 50 years old
- 3. We know relatively little about the causes of cancer across Asian American populations.
- Historically, research in Asian Americans has been underfunded
- Most studies do not collect detailed information about immigration histories
- Anti-Asian discrimination contributes to many health risks, but the connection to cancer remains understudied



We will launch the first national cohort of Asian American adults for the study of cancer in 2024.

We envision ASPIRE (ASian American Prospective Research) to:

- Follow more than 50,000 men and women over time
- Capture information ranging from structural and social drivers of health to genetic and biological factors

ASPIRE is funded by the National Cancer Institute and led by researchers at UCSF, UC Irvine, UC Davis, UCLA, Cedars-Sinai, Temple University, Jefferson University, and University of Hawaii.

The ultimate vision of ASPIRE is to serve as an expansive, contemporary resource, advancing our understanding of cancer and achieving health equity in Asian American populations.
